LAWS OF THE SPORT OF BOWLS

In this issue, the irregularities regarding "Playing Out of Turn" will be discussed. There are several scenarios where the above could occur and what correct decision should be made for each of them.

At the Start of an End

- ➢ If a player notices that the wrong team or Singles player has delivered the jack in any end, the correct team or Singles player will re-start the end. The same decision applies even if the player who delivers the jack has delivered his first bowl;
- However, if the opponent has also played his first bowl (a bowl has been played by each team or Singles player), play in that end must continue in that order;

In the Middle of an End

- ➢ If a player plays out of turn, the opposing skip can stop the bowl and return it to the player to play it in the proper order;
- If the bowl has come to rest and has not disturbed the head, the opposing skip must choose whether to: (a) leave the head as it is and have their team play
 - two bowls one after the other to get back to the proper order of play; or (b) return the bowl and get back to the proper order of play.
- If the bowl has disturbed the head, the opposing skip must choose whether to: (a) leave the disturbed head as it is and have their team play two bowls one after the other to get back to the proper order of play; (b) replace the head in its former position, return the bowl and go back to the proper order of play; or (c) declare the end dead.
- ➤ If a bowl has been played by each team or player in Singles before the players discover that one of them has played out of turn, play in that end must continue in that order.
